AUSTIN STREET CENTER

For over 30 years, Austin Street Center has specialized in caring for the most vulnerable homeless men and women in Dallas. Beyond meeting basic needs, Austin Street is committed to individualized care for each person who comes to us for help.

- Meals Service Every meal served at Austin Street is prepared off-site and delivered to the shelter
 by volunteer groups from churches, local businesses, and other community groups who then serve
 the meal to each of our guests. Lunch is served to 120 guests, and breakfast and dinner are served
 for 400. Meal service must be scheduled in advance.
- Group Projects Austin Street can accommodate a few larger groups each year for special
 projects, which have included painting, landscaping, organizing a group activity, and more.
 Representatives of groups looking for a special opportunity should contact us for a tour and

- *Teen Ambassadors* Formerly the DMA Teen Docent program, the Teen Ambassador program provides opportunities for high school students to initiate and deepen their relationship with the DMA. Teen Ambassadors lead summer family programs and gallery activities for young visitors (ages 5–12). Family programs range from drop-in art-making activities in the Center for Creative Connections to Family Storytime in the galleries.
- *Teen Advisory Council* The <u>Teen Advisory Council</u>, or TAC for short, is a group of highly motivated high school students who help shape the direction of how the Museum engages with youth audiences. Members of the council develop innovative interdisciplinary programming for Museum visitors of all ages and serve as ambassadors for the Museum to the community. Teen Advisory Council members commit to attending two Thursday evening planning meetings a month and volunteering at hosted events at least once a month from September through July.

Service Opportunities: Equest offers a variety of volunteer opportunities for individuals and groups. No prior horse experience is required! We will teach you everything you need to know at one of our volunteer training sessions.

• LEADER - The leader's responsibility is the horse at all times. The leader helps maintain the horse's pace, calmness, and focus while allowing the client to do as much as he or she is able.

• SIDEWALKER - The sidewalker's role is to help the client with balance and reinforce instructions

in the lesson.

• BARN HELPER - Barn helpers are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness, orderliness, and function of the barn as well as individual horse stalls, paddocks, and arenas. Barn helpers are needed seven days a week between 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Barn helpers do not need to schedule

work hours but are welcome to pop in when time permits.

• EVENT HELPER - We heavily rely on our team of volunteers to help with event preparation,

execution, and break-down.

• HANDYMAN OR HANDYWOMAN - Do you have a knack for fixing things? We need you! We need those brave individuals willing to tackle electrical, plumbing, fence repairs, hammering, and

everything else that goes along with running two state-of-the-art equine facilities.

Meal Preparation Overview:

- Volunteers will assist and help prepare meals for students in the Dallas Independent School District.
- Volunteers will follow the instructions of the on-site Production Manager.
- Volunteers will maintain kitchen cleanliness at all times.
- Volunteers must wash their hands and wear gloves while handling bread, meat and dairy products at all times.
- Volunteers will make ham and cheese sandwiches, then cut them in half and bag them using the automated bagging machine.
- Volunteers will assemble the meals (using an assembly line process) into a brown paper bag with an apple and/or orange, applesauce, sandwich and dessert and then pack them into large cooler bags for delivery.
- Volunteers will assist in cleaning the kitchen (sweeping, mopping, washing dishes, cleaning tables, breaking down boxes, throwing out the trash, etc.

- *Team Jubilee* Join the team! Become a sports coach or assistant coach to help neighborhood children learn healthy lifestyles, character development, and teamwork skills through soccer and basketball. Supplies, equipment, and assistance are provided through Jubilee and the YMCA, and parents are eager to help. No experience required-- ready, set, go! Practices are Monday through Thursday 6:30-8 p.m. Games on Saturdays 10-11:30 a.m.

MANEGAIT THERAPEUTIC HORSEMANSHIP

Here are a few examples of the types of duties for volunteers:

• Walking Dogs - Dogs are walked at least twice a day in the morning and afternoon.

- Cat Rooms Help maintain cat and kitten rooms, clean cages, change litter boxes.
- Kennel Work Clean cages, laundry, general up-keep and maintenance.
- General Help Help with receptionist work such as, answering phones, greeting visitors, assisting with mailings and general office work.
- Foster Home Program Care for young, recovering or pregnant animals in your home. You'll be saving a life!
- Fundraising Assist with fundraising events and activities.
- Computer Data entry in shelter database.
- Volunteer Committee Welcome new volunteers, coordinate and assist with volunteer training.
- Special Events Assist with planning, coordinating and staffing at Operation Kindness and community events.
- Adoption Counseling Match dogs and cats with potential adopters to find their new home, provide counseling to adopters, and complete adoption paperwork.
- Humane Education Assist with educating our youth by going out to schools and providing youth tours at the shelter.
- Ambassador Ambassadors are volunteers that will commit to a weekly schedule in Intake,
 Medical, Kennel or Development. Additional training will be provided.
- Nursing Care We visit 2 facilities monthly. Volunteers take their own pets
